Literacy Interventions at Kettle Creek P.S.

We are pleased to let you know that our team has spent much of September and October gathering data to assess what the learning needs in the area of Literacy are. We have noticed that generally speaking, some students are not at the reading levels that they typically had been prior to the pandemic. With that in mind, our team has organized a variety of interventions for students to close these gaps. At this time, we are very proud to report to you that we currently have 123 students in Grades 1-6 who are receiving extra programming to improve their reading skills. In 6-8 weeks, our team will reassess and collect follow up data to ensure that our interventions are effective. Thanks for all the support you give to us. We know that working together, we will reach our goal.

SWPH School Health Newsletter

Cold and flu season is upon us! While COVID-19 is still circulating in our communities, this time of year is a good reminder that hand washing, utilizing cough and sneeze etiquette, masking, and vaccinations are all important tools in our toolbox to stay well against a variety of illnesses. The School and child care screening tool (<https://www.ontario.ca/school-screening/>) can still be utilized daily to gauge the appropriateness of a child or adult being at school. Please remember: If you are sick with respiratory symptoms, or similar such as runny nose, congestion or sore throat, including with a diagnosis of COVID-19, stay home until you are without a fever and symptoms have been improving for 24 hours, and 48 hours if symptoms including nausea, vomiting and diarrhea are present. If you have COVID-19, you are required to wear your mask for 10 days from symptom onset. Remember that this information is subject to change. The best way to understand if you are eligible to enter or return to school is to complete the school and childcare screening tool online. This can be done daily as it has been in the past for all members of the school community.
